The scrotum houses the testicles or testes (singular: testis), and provides passage for blood vessels, nerves, and muscles related to testicular function. The testes are a pair of male gonads that produce sperm and reproductive hormones. Each testis is approximately 2.5 by 3.8 cm (1.5 by 1 inch) in size and divided into wedge-shaped lobes by septa.

5.7 Protein Synthesis – Human Biology

Translation is the second part of the central dogma of molecular biology: RNA → Protein. It is the process in which the genetic code in mRNA is read to make a protein. Translation is illustrated in Figure 5.7.4. After mRNA leaves the nucleus, it moves to a ribosome, which consists of rRNA and proteins. The ribosome reads the sequence of codons in mRNA, and molecules of tRNA bring ...

As described in the In Principle section, DNA from a single whole genome is fragmented and assembled into a single sequencing library, and then sequenced in single run. Approximately 2–3 million SNPs and small InDels can be expected in a typical human genome, of which only 15–20,000 will occur in the coding region of the genome.

To think about the basis of this pH effect, recall three important factors: (1) $\text{CO}_2/\text{HCO}_3^-$ – exist in equilibrium within biological systems and can effect the overall pH, (2) deoxyHb is a stronger base than $\text{O}_2 \cdot \text{Hb}$, and (3) in red blood cells (RBCs), there is an enzyme called carbonic anhydrase, which catalyzes the hydration of CO_2 by water to form HCO_3^- .
